The paper has been foundational in discussions about how ecosystems adapt to environmental stressors. These studies cover the three interconnected dimensions of resilience—personal, social, and environmental—demonstrating how resilience is essential for well-being and sustainability at multiple levels. Together, these dimensions highlight the importance of fostering resilience at multiple levels to promote overall well-being and sustainability.

The impacts presented in Table 2 have important implications for the design and implementation of technology-enhanced art interventions. By understanding the potential effects of such interventions on discourse practices, artists, educators, and practitioners can tailor their approaches to maximize the desired outcomes and contribute to personal, social, and environmental resilience.

The findings suggest that technology-enhanced art interventions have the potential to foster more effective communication, collaboration, and empathy among participants, ultimately promoting social connection and sustainable discourse practices. By harnessing the power of digital tools and creative processes to address pressing social and environmental issues, these interventions can support personal well-being, encourage civic engagement, and facilitate critical discussions about the world we share.

Resilience is the ability to adapt and recover from various challenges, and it can be categorized into three interconnected dimensions: personal, social, and environmental (Folke, 2006; Masten, 2014; Norris et al., 2008). Personal resilience refers to an individual's capacity to cope with and overcome adversity, ensuring well-being and growth (Masten, 2014). Social resilience emphasizes the collective ability of communities and societies to collaborate, adapt, and support one another in the face of adversity (Norris et al., 2008). Environmental resilience focuses on the capacity of ecosystems to recover from disturbances and maintain their functions and services (Folke, 2006). Together, these dimensions highlight the importance of fostering resilience at multiple levels to promote overall well-being and sustainability.

4. Conclusion

In conclusion, this study demonstrates the potential of technology-enhanced art interventions to foster sustainable discourse practices and social connections in diverse communities. By examining the intersection of art, technology, and discourse analysis through a sustainability lens, the research highlights the importance of promoting personal, social, and environmental resilience to enhance overall well-being.

The findings emphasize the significance of adopting participatory and collaborative approaches in the design and implementation of technology-enhanced art projects while incorporating local cultural elements and traditions. 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Appendix 1

The instruction and rubrics of the intervention

The intervention of this research involved the implementation of technology-enhanced art projects that were aimed at fostering sustainable discourse practices and social connection within a chosen community or group. The following instructions provided a step-by-step guide to designing and executing the intervention:

1. The target community or group was identified by choosing a community or group that could benefit from a technology-enhanced art intervention. Factors such as access to technology, socio-cultural context, and existing discourse practices within the community were considered.
2. Project goals and objectives were established by defining the specific aims of the intervention, such as promoting civic engagement, fostering intercultural understanding, or addressing environmental issues. The goals were ensured to align with the needs and interests of the target community.
3. Appropriate digital tools and platforms were selected by choosing the digital tools and platforms that best suited the project goals, target community, and available resources. Options that were considered included social media, virtual reality, interactive installations, or digital storytelling tools.
4. A participatory and collaborative approach was developed by designing the intervention to encourage active participation and collaboration among community members. This involved incorporating co-design processes, shared decision-making, or collaborative art-making activities.
5. Local cultural elements and traditions were incorporated by ensuring that the intervention reflected the unique cultural heritage and artistic practices of the target community. This promoted inclusivity, cultural preservation, and a sense of local identity.

For this study, the chosen community or group was a local neighborhood in a medium-sized city near Isfahan, characterized by a diverse population in terms of age, cultural background, and socioeconomic status. The neighborhood faced various challenges related to social cohesion, environmental sustainability, and civic engagement.

The community had access to basic technological infrastructure and digital tools, with a majority of residents owning smartphones or having access to the internet at home or through public facilities. There were local cultural institutions or community centers that served as potential partners or venues for the technology-enhanced art intervention.

This diverse urban community presented an ideal context for exploring the potential of technology-enhanced art in fostering sustainable discourse practices and social connection, as it allowed for the investigation of how digital tools and creative processes could address the unique needs and aspirations of a heterogeneous group of individuals. Additionally, the insights gained from the intervention in this context could be valuable for informing similar projects in other urban neighborhoods or diverse communities.

Appendix 2

The instruction and rubrics for discourse analysis

In the context of technology-enhanced art interventions and their impacts on discourse practices and social connection, various linguistic features were intended to be used in the analysis of the language employed in 8 research publications. The linguistic features that were considered included:

1. **Lexical choice:** The specific vocabulary and terminology that were used in the context of technology-enhanced art interventions, discourse practices, and social connection were intended to be investigated. The choice of words that indicated various concepts, ideas, and themes within the research publications were paid attention to.
2. **Syntactic structures:** The sentence structures, grammatical patterns, and how information was organized within sentences and paragraphs were examined. The contribution of these structures to the overall meaning and understanding of the text was analyzed.
3. **Cohesion and coherence:** How ideas were connected, and the text was structured to create a logical flow of information, were studied. Linguistic markers such as conjunctions, transitional phrases, and referential expressions that helped to establish links between ideas were identified.
4. **Rhetorical devices:** The use of persuasive techniques, such as metaphor, analogy, and repetition, which were employed to emphasize certain points or engage the reader, were identified.
5. **Pragmatic features:** The context in which the language was used and how it influenced the meaning and interpretation of the text was considered. The author's intentions and how they were conveyed through the language used were examined.

By analyzing these linguistic features in the research publications related to technology-enhanced art interventions and their impacts, a deeper understanding of the discourse practices and social connections discussed within the texts was gained. This helped identify common themes and potential impacts in the thematic analysis.

Appendix 3

Literature Review

A literature search was conducted by utilizing scholarly databases like Google Scholar, JSTOR, EBSCOhost, and Web of Science to search for published research articles, case studies, and reviews related to technology-enhanced art interventions, discourse practices, and social connection. 12 sources were selected by reviewing the abstracts and, where available, full texts of the search results to identify sources that reported findings or discussed themes relevant to the research topic. The selected sources were analyzed by examining their research questions, methodologies, findings, and conclusions.
