According to Edward Burnett Tylor (1832-1917), culture is a complex system that includes knowledge, beliefs, arts, morals, laws, customs, abilities, and habits acquired by humans as members of society. Culture has several functions that are present and can be felt by the community. The main function of culture is to learn the heritage of the ancestors, then the next generation needs to review whether the heritage needs to be renewed or continued and if abandoned then the culture can be damaged.

Usually this hanzi is pasted upside down, this is not merely done like that but there is a hidden meaning in it.

Each Chinese hanzi character is formed by various characters that contain symbolic meanings within them. They reflect human expressions and feelings. Chinese characters have the potential to represent things or events, including both good and bad. Some Chinese Hanzi characters are considered by the Chinese people as positive symbols, for example the Hanzi character 福. Hanzi 福 itself means luck or happiness. It is believed by the Chinese that sticking this hanzi on the doorstep during Chinese New Year celebrations will bring blessings and luck to the owner of the house.

Meaning of Hanzi Character 福

The specialty of Hanzi 福 characters is that they bring good luck to some people who install them. Hanzi 福 is a part of Chinese culture that has been practiced for generations. This Hanzi 福 character is often found during the Chinese New Year celebrations or commonly known as 春节. Literally, the Hanzi character 福 means good luck or happiness. If we put these Hanzi characters on the doors, windows, and walls of Chinese homes, it is believed that it will bring good luck into the house. Hanzi 福 can also be translated as "good fortune, happiness, luck, blessing". Hanzi 福 is also one of the important symbols in Chinese culture and is often used in various celebratory occasions. Historically, Hanzi 福 has also been a savior for some people.

Hanzi \overline{a} has evolved in its writing, to understand the meaning of hanzi \overline{a} , we can look at the radicals in this hanzi. Hanzi \overline{a} consists of 4 radicals which are divided into two parts, the right and the left. On the left side of Hanzi \overline{a} , there is the radical $\overline{\pi}$ which is usually a character that has this radical associated with worship, god, deity, or something mystical and spiritual. On the right side of Hanzi \overline{a} , there are three radicals namely -, \Box , \boxplus , all three of which are believed to represent the balance of human life. At the very top right is the hanzi -. The meaning of the hanzi - is a number that is likened to the entirety of human life. The second part after the - hanzi is the \Box hanzi. The hanzi \Box means mouth, which is interpreted as eating and drinking. Eating and drinking are the primary needs of humans, and as a whole, it means all the daily needs of humans. The last radical on the right side of the hanzi \overline{a} is the hanzi Ξ which means paddy field, this hanzi is interpreted as property or wealth that humans need. Combined, the three radicals on the right side of hanzi \overline{a} mean a person whose needs are met.

meaning of this hanzi 福 is that if a person has good spirituality and all his material needs are sufficient, then he can be said to live with 福 or full of happiness.

Origin of The Hanzi 福 Belief

In the Ming Dynasty, there was an Emperor named Zhū Yuánzhāng who had a consort named Mǎ Huáng. One day Emperor Zhu went to a small town and saw a group of people laughing at a picture. When the Emperor saw the picture he was very angry, because the picture had a woman with big feet holding a watermelon that was thought to resemble his wife. The Emperor thought that the picture was a form of mockery for his wife where his wife happened to have big feet. The Emperor immediately sent soldiers to find out who was responsible for this incident and ordered to be killed. But the empress who was kind enough to hear this ordered her trusted bodyguards to ask the citizens to write and paste the character 福 on the doorsteps of the houses in the small town so that the soldiers sent by the emperor could not find the house that had committed the crime. So from this story, the Hanzi 福 character is interpreted to bring safety, blessings, and good fortune to the people who believe in pasting the Hanzi 福 character on the front of their houses.

In Feng Shui, Feng Shui is an ancient belief that originated in China. It deals with the principles of harmony and balance in life. Feng Shui itself comes from the Chinese language which consists of two characters, namely fēng (风) which means wind and shuǐ (水) which means water. In Feng Shui beliefs, wind and water are considered as two important elements that can affect human life. Feng Shui beliefs are concerned with the use of colors and symbols in the surrounding environment to create a positive energy balance. One of the important symbols in Feng Shui belief is the Hanzi character 福. According to Feng Shui beliefs, sticking Hanzi 福 characters in the right position can help create an energy balance in the surrounding environment.In Feng Shui beliefs, colors also have an important role in creating energy balance.Red is considered the most powerful color in Feng Shui and symbolizes fire, luck, and protection. However, the butler claimed that the 福 pasted upside down would bring good luck until or unless it arrived. Eventually, the emperor decided to forgive the servant and approved the use of the upside-down Hanzi character 福 as a symbol of good luck and happiness. In this case, it is inferred that the reversed Hanzi 福 characters can bring happiness or safety. Although the origin of the reversed Hanzi 福 character cannot be ascertained for sure, the belief is still growing in Chinese society and is often used in various celebratory occasions.

The Hanzi character 福 has many different histories and stories from different times and periods in Chinese history. However, it is undeniable that these Hanzi 福 characters have the same meaning, which is to bring safety, goodness, and blessings. The Uniqueness of Hanzi 福 Characters

The Hanzi character 福 also has another meaning in that some people believe that pasting this reversed Hanzi character 福到了 symbolizes that it expresses fu 到 (dào/arrive), which signifies that good fortune arrives. In Chinese, the word dào 倒 means "to arrive or arrive dào 到". 福到了 is a Chinese expression that means "luck or happiness has arrived". This expression is related to the reversed Hanzi character 福, 福到了. According to Chinese belief, sticking this upside-down Hanzi 福 character on the door or wall of a house is believed to bring good luck and happiness. The Hanzi character 福 itself means luck and happiness in Chinese culture.

Identic Color of Hanzi Character 福

The two main colors in fengshuĭ \square 𝔅 are black and red. These two colors play an important role in creating energy balance in the environment. Red is considered the most powerful color in fengshuĭ and symbolizes fire, luck, and protection. The Chinese believe red can bring happiness, and can ward off bad

luck and ward off evil. Black is considered a strong color and represents power, grandeur, strength, mystery, authority, and elegance. The golden yellow color in the Hanzi character 福 has different meanings in Chinese culture. Although the meaning of the golden yellow color in Hanzi 福 is different, Hanzi 福 is still considered an important symbol in Chinese culture and is often used in various celebratory occasions.

China itself has a tradition that must be done every year, namely the Chinese New Year celebration and usually attaches Hanzi 福 characters as home decorations commonly found on the walls, doors and windows of the house. All in all, Hanzi 福 is not only a symbol, but also has a great meaning to the Chinese people.
